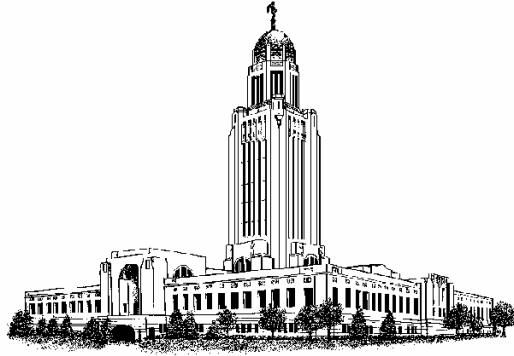

Chair Kenney and members of the Board of Regents,

We write to you today with concerns about the proposed transaction for the University of Nebraska to take control of Nebraska Medicine, announced January second. While the Board of Regents Agenda Item Summary for the January ninth meeting indicates that the Board has "negotiated the final agreement over a series of meetings in the past 18 months," the public and the Legislature have had very limited visibility to understand the proposal, its impact, and any financial implications of such a transaction.

The University of Nebraska and Nebraska Medicine are two institutions of tremendous significance to our state, and any major changes to the existing structures must be carefully considered. We would urge you to postpone action on the \$800 million proposed transaction to ensure all viable alternatives have been considered and until all stakeholders understand the impact of the proposal for the state and these two great institutions.


